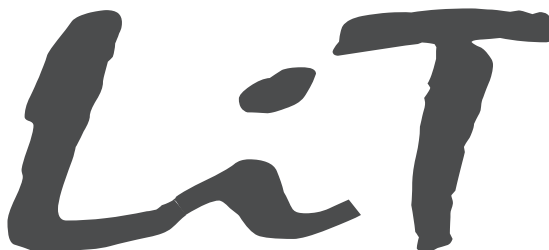

Matt Brester was a loving, empathetic, devoted, caring, hard-working, and understanding doctor, husband, and father. Born in Cozad, Nebraska on January 19, 1972 Matt spent his childhood in Dodge, Nebraska. Some of the happiest and most influential times in Matt's young life involved his high school years at Mt. Michael. Matt graduated Mt. Michael in 1990 and soon after decided to serve his country in the United States Army where Matt was as a medic for four years. This experience reinforced his passion for medicine and his desire to help others. Upon completion of his service, Matt enrolled at UNO and began working at the University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC). It was there that Matt met his wife to be Michelle. Matt's diagnosis of cancer came shortly after their engagement.

Following his diagnosis, Matt had his thyroid removed and endured radiation with the hopes his cancer would be put into remission. Matt and Michelle were married on December 26, 1997 and Matt continued with his studies, graduated from UNO, and was accepted to Medical School at the University of NE Medical Center. Undeterred by his diagnosis, Matt vowed to live life to its fullest and pursue his dream of becoming a doctor.

Matt began medical school in the fall of 1999. Throughout medical school, Matt's Christmas and spring breaks were filled with surgeries and radiation. Matt graduated from UNMC in the Spring of 2003 and made a decision to leave the Husker state behind for Matt's residency in Winston-Salem, North Carolina at Wake Forest University. Matt quickly made friends and adapted to life in the South -- while making it clear to all who met him he was and would always be a Husker.

Loving Nebraska like Matt did, he felt a pull to return home upon completion of his residency. Matt was recruited to work for a practice in Omaha and began his career in earnest, doing what he loved to do -- helping others. Upon his return to Omaha, his battle with cancer intensified. He underwent internal and external radiation and chemotherapy.

While thinking of others, Matt kept much of his battle with cancer personal and private, trying not to burden anyone with his struggle. This privacy allowed Matt and his family to focus on living and enjoying each precious day. Reflecting on his wife, children, and his opportunity to help others, Matt felt blessed in life. With resolve that seemed to grow with each surgery, Matt was relentless in his fight against cancer. To Matt the joy he received each day he was able to share with his wife and five children greatly overshadowed any amount of physical or emotional strain cancer could inflict.

Never giving up hope, always positive, and content in knowing he lived his life to the fullest, Matt passed away peacefully in the presence of his wife Michelle on February 19, 2008.
